

Dear Friends and Neighbors,

The supporters of Measure P – El Dorado Hills incorporation – highlight portions of the Comprehensive Fiscal Analysis.

They leave other things out.

Here are some examples that you might consider before voting one way or the other on Measure P:

- To maintain a balanced budget for the new city, 8,400 new homes must be built bringing the new city's population to 50,325.
- When compared to similar sized cities, your new city will have per capita revenues lower than Yuba City and half of Folsom's. That means less money for city services.
- The Comprehensive Fiscal Analysis points out that the new city will have only half the funds per capita for police protection when compared to Folsom. (Even with skimping on police, in the second year the new city will run an operating deficit of \$936,528.)

I have concluded that Measure P is bad for El Dorado Hills. I hope you find this information helpful in coming to your own conclusion.
